Level 2 Diploma in Site Carpentry

Is for candidates who work or want to work as a Site Carpenter in the construction sector. This Qualification allows candidates to learn, develop and practise the skills required for employment and/or career progression in Site Carpentry.

It covers the following skills:

- Carry out first fix flooring and roofing
- Carry out first fix frames, partitions and stairs
- Carry out second fixing operations
- Carry out carpentry maintenance
- Set up and operate a circular saw



The qualification forms the technical certificate for the Construction Building Apprenticeship Framework. It allows candidates to progress into employment or to the following City & Guilds qualifications:

- Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Wood Occupations
- Level 3 Diploma in Site Carpentry

To achieve the Level 2 Diploma in Site Carpentry (6706-23), learners must achieve 52 credits from the mandatory units. Total GLH – 452.

City & Guilds Level 3 NVQ Diploma in Wood Occupations

This qualification is for candidates who work or want to work as a site carpenter, architectural joiner, wheelwrighter, or a shopfitter in the construction sector. It allows candidates to learn, develop and practise the skills required for employment and/or career progression in carpentry and joinery. It covers the following specialist areas:

- Site carpentry
- Architectural joinery
- Wheelwrighting
- Shopfitting bench work.

This qualification forms the competence-based element of the Advanced Apprenticeship in Construction Building (Level 3), Pathway 2: Wood Occupations. Apprentices who follow the Site Carpentry/Shopfitting pathway can have a varied career working on new builds, refurbishments or in specialist areas. Architectural Joinery apprentices will see a variety of wood products in production.

This apprenticeship will enable progression to:

NVQ Level 6 Diploma in Construction Contracting Operations
 NVQ Level 6 Diploma in Construction Site Management

After gaining work experience in the chosen occupational area there are opportunities to progress into occupational work supervision, management or technical support areas or a higher level qualification in construction.

To achieve the City & Guilds Level 3 NVQ Diploma in Wood Occupations (Construction) – Site Carpentry (6571-51), learners must achieve 9 units in total; 7 units must be achieved from the mandatory units & a minimum of 2 units from the optional units available.

Get your Apprentices and other employers trained for their CSR card. All construction workers must undertake health and safety training every 4 years and must hold a level 3 NVQ to qualify for their Gold card to be able to work on site.

To become registered, workers must complete a minimum of one day health and safety training, delivered by our tutors on-site. Operatives can also be assessed to ascertain their level of competency in their skill area. They will then receive a photographic identity card that provides proof of their health and safety training and their skills and qualifications, if appropriate.
